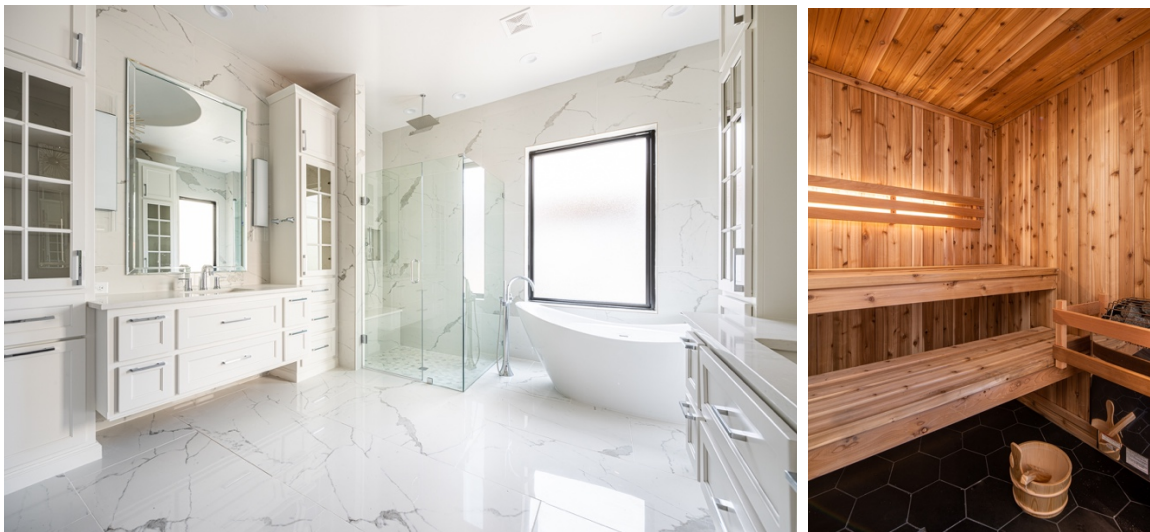


4. Functional Storage & Organization
